Subject: 2026 State of South Carolina Holidays vs. Federal/Banking Holidays

As we approach the 2026 calendar year, please be reminded that there will be days when both the State of South Carolina and federal banks (including the Federal Reserve) observe holidays. Please note that some holidays may be observed by the state but not recognized at the federal level. Below is a comparison of the **2026 State of South Carolina Holidays** and **Federal/Banking Holidays**.

### Reminders:

- **No Wire Transfers or ACH Files** will be processed when banks and the Federal Reserve are closed. Please remember that if a holiday falls on a Monday, ACH payments will be delayed by one business day due to the closure of the Federal Reserve and most banking institutions.
- **Accounts Payable Adjustments:** Agencies are encouraged to review payment schedules and make necessary adjustments well in advance, especially when South Carolina State offices are closed, but banks remain open.
